OUR SEARCH FOR NEXT BISHOP OF NEWARK: As many of us know this past February Bishop Mark Beckwith called for the election of the next bishop as he approached retirement. As a part of the process for electing and calling a new bishop our Diocese has formed a Search Committee (our own Michele Simon co-chairs this team). The first step of the process gathers information that will be published for prospective candidates. Our diocesan family needs our immediate help in two ways, an open written survey and listening table gatherings.

SEARCH SURVEY: This survey was designed to give all members of the diocese the opportunity to provide your perspective as the Bishop Search/Nominating Committee develops the Diocesan Profile. The profile will provide vital information on our diocese to all who feel called to become the XI Bishop of our diocese. The survey is offered in three languages (English, Spanish and Korean*), each in two forms (online and printable PDF). This Sunday we will have computers and paper versions available for you to complete the survey at St Paul's, or you can complete the survey: <https://www.surveymonkey.com/r/52Y5NJH>. The survey period will only be open until Wednesday, August 16.

SEARCH LISTENING Table: This gatherings across the Diocese will provide more interaction and dialogue regarding our life as a Diocese and discernment for the next bishop. We hope you can attend one of these Listening Meetings. Several are scheduled on a variety of days and in various locations. Please note that some meetings are for targeted audiences (i.e., Lay only, Clergy only or diocesan staff only).
